- ✓ Any kind of hard or soft plastic or metal or glass.

FOOD CONTAINERS & WRAPPERS

- Hard plastic pie tins
- Plastic coffee cup lids
- Plastic food packaging
- Plastic stirrer sticks
- Plastic straws
- Plastic take-out containers
- Plastic utensils
- Yogurt-type containers
- Aluminum/Tin foil
- Metal foil on top of yogurt containers

LIQUID CONTAINERS

- Aluminum cans
- Metal cans
- Glass bottles with lids
- Glass containers
- Plastic bottles with lids
- Plastic milk jugs
- Plastic water cups
- Milk and juice containers

MISC. OFFICE

- Scotch tape dispensers

PRIOR TO RECYCLING, PLEASE:

- Empty all liquids into sink
- Rinse all food residue from containers.

PAPER

- ✓ Anything that rips or tears—even with staples or paperclips.

MISC. OFFICE

- Copy paper (even with staples or paper clips)
- Colored and craft paper
- Envelopes (including with plastic window)
- Post-it notes
- Packaging boxes
- Cardboard
- Newspaper
- Magazines
- Catalogs
- Phone books
- Soft-cover books
- Pendaflex hanging folders (remove metal strips)
- Manila folders Paper bags
- Junk mail
- Pamphlets
- Flyers

CLEAN FOOD & BEVERAGE

- Unused paper napkins
- Paper Sandwich Boxes
- Coffee and paper cups
- Hot cup insulators
- Paper Straw Covers

*** NO MILK OR JUICE CARTONS**

- Even if they are made of cardboard, milk and juice cartons have a plastic inner liner and should be placed in the **Metal, Glass & Plastic bin.**

ORGANICS FOR COMPOST

- ✓ All food and organic waste, plus certain non-edible items.

FOOD

- Fruit, vegetables and beans
- Meat and poultry
- Seafood and shellfish
- Bones
- Bread and bakery foods
- Grains, pasta and rice
- Cheese
- Fats, oils and salad dressing

NON-EDIBLE ORGANIC & PLANTS

- Flowers
- Floral trimmings
- Leaves
- Plants
- Potting soil
- Tea bags
- Coffee grinds
- Eggshells

SOILED PAPER PRODUCTS

- Used napkins
- Soiled tissues
- Used paper towels
- Used paper plates
- Wooden stirrer sticks
- Plant-based packaging material

*** NO PLASTICS**

- Even if they are labeled as compostable or biodegradable, plastics do not belong in compost bins.
- If you use a plastic bag to collect food scraps (or other organic waste), place the bag in the trash after emptying contents into brown Organics bin.

*** NO PRODUCE STICKERS/LABELS**

- Stickers placed on fruit and vegetables by markets gum up and clog compost processing machines and equipment. Please remove them prior to composting.

TRASH

- ✓ Any remaining non-food and non-recyclables.

SYNTHETIC MATERIALS

- FedEx no-rip (Tyvek®) envelopes
- Styrofoam packing material and peanuts
- Hard styrofoam blocks
- Styrofoam coffee cups
- Rubber bands
- Twist ties
- Pens
- Plastic bags
- Gift bags
- Bubble wrap
- Candy wrappers
- Plastic "film" products
- Paper take-out containers with heavy wax or plastic coating

*** NO ELECTRONICS**

It is illegal in New York City to discard electronics in the trash.

The Durst Organization offers proper collection of the following items for optimal recycling:

- Batteries*
